VOTING MATTERS Library Budget & Trustee Election

Tuesday, May 18, 2021

Our Library operates on a very modest budget which needs to be approved by voters in the Cobleskill-Richmondville School District. The proposed budget for 2022 is for \$304,572, of which \$274,000 needs to be supported by taxes. Fifty-eight percent of this covers personnel costs; seventeen percent is for building, equipment and utilities; eleven percent is for books and other items in the collection, and the remaining monies are for office costs and programming.

Please vote at the William H Golding School or the Joseph B Radez School between 9AM -9 PM to approve this proposed operating budget and to select the trustees running for election or re-election. See the last page or visit the Library for more details.


100 Years of Trustees

When the Library opened the number of trustees was only five. The list of duties of the trustees was so slim that five were able to handle it. The duties of the trustees can be summed up in two words: physical and fiscal.

Today the trustees have a fiduciary responsibility to the taxpayers of the school district. In the beginning it was only the few who organized the Library. Later it became a Town of Cobleskill Library and only Cobleskill residents were trustees. The local businesspeople participated in the running of things.

Norman Olsen was the Library trustee responsible for the Library joining the Mohawk Valley Library Association. (MVLA). Later it became the Mohawk Valley Library System (MVLS).

In 1999 the Library became a Cobleskill-Richmondville School District Library and the trustees are elected by the entire school district. During the Library's growth the jobs became many and more trustees were needed to carry out the items to be looked after. Eleven trustees now do the work necessary to run the physical plant and to watch over and provide for the financial needs. *Harriet Berard, TCL Board Historian*

Our Library During a Pandemic

In March 2020, The Community Library faced the task of closing our doors in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The six-month closure while difficult provided the opportunity to complete a few projects as well as find new ways to be your Library operating under new health and safety constraints. Fortunately, the Board made the decision to keep our staff employed and to work on projects like moving the children's room and separating the juvenile nonfiction from the adult nonfiction collection, converting all the lighting in the Library to LED and completing the new accessibility ramp and entry to the building. Staff were resilient in converting programs from in-person to virtual and moving from in-building browsing to a safe delivery of resources through curbside service. Adjustments to lending allowed for borrowing more items for a longer period of time. Fines continue to be waived on all items. We recently purchased 11 Chromebooks with support from SEEC. They will be added to the collection and can be borrowed with your Library Card. Trustees even began work on the next Long Range Plan by holding focus group meetings through Zoom hosted by MVLS staff. We want to thank everyone for your patience, it has been a difficult year. Between COVID and the entryway construction project delaying access to the building our circulation, attendance, and programming numbers for 2020 decreased however we are striving to make improvements and with your continued patience, support and input we hope to be a better Library on the other side of COVID.
