Day Writers: Sat., Dec. 6 & Fri., Dec. 19 at 11:00 am

This program is for folks seeking a creative outlet where they can write for fun and self-reflection. The moderator will provide a few prompts and exercises and let writers respond in whatever way they'd like, whether it's poetry, short fiction, a political rant, nature writing, a personal memory, or some new literary hybrid no one's ever tried before.

Soap Making with Mineral Springs Soap: Dec. 10 at 6:00 pm

Learn how to make soap with our friends from Mineral Springs Soap! Watch a demonstration of the soapmaking process, then make a fun crystal soap sample to take home.
