

Tania Konwinski, originally from Petaluma, CA, graduated from the University of California Los Angeles (UCLA) in 2011 with a BA in Cultural Geography. She had lived in Denmark, South Korea, Washington DC, and all across the Bay Area of California before finding her way to New York city in 2014 to pursue fine art, theater, and music. In 2016 she completed her largest art commission to date in San Francisco, [*Reunion*](#), a 10 x 10 ft installation piece still in public view today. From 2017 to 2021 she was the general operations manager for The Old American Can Factory, a 130,000 square foot arts complex built in 1890, located in South Brooklyn. She oversaw their leasing, maintenance, events programs, and supported their tenant population of roughly 300 persons. Since 2021 she has operated [*Rose Hollow Design*](#), a small reproduction business of her black ink artwork. Tanja is a member of the Schoharie County Youth Bureau Advisory Board and for the last year she has been developing a community project to bring mental health support to Schoharie County teens. She has acted as the Program Director for The Waterfall Center for Bioregional Learning since August 2025. She has been an active member of the Community Library Board of Trustees since November 2025 and is excited to bring her passion for literature, art, and public spaces to her work with the board. She has been visiting Schoharie County for the last decade and officially moved to Warnerville in May, 2023.
